ARC NI facilitates a number of networks which provide opportunities to meet with peers and relevant stakeholders, share information in a safe and respectful forum with a view to agree collaborative action to achieve real change.

Adult Safeguarding Champion's (ASC) Network¹

Established in 2017, ARC NI facilitates this peer support network to build the capacity of organisations and specifically Champions to meet the requirements of the regional safeguarding policy. In a shared safe space, peer ASC's meet to discuss policy, procedure and practice. DoH Policy has a standing agenda slot to update on progress relating to the Adult Protection Bill.

Minimisation of Restrictive Practice Peer Network²

Established in 2024, ARC NI facilitates this peer support network for the identified Director /Senior Manager is responsible for articulating the organisational vision and strategy to minimise the use of restrictive practices across all services. In a shared safe space, peers meet to discuss policy, procedure and practice.

Registered Managers Network³

Established in 2018, ARC NI facilitates this peer support network in recognition of the responsibilities a Registered Manager carries. The network discusses common operational challenges, explores solutions and shares best practice with a view of offering additional support to the Registered Manager role.

RQIA & ARC NI Executive Exchange

Established in 2004, ARC NI facilitates Registered Providers of Regulated services to meet with the CEO and Senior Inspectors within RQIA. This meeting provides a safe space to discuss strategic challenges and opportunities for collaboration to better improve the services and supports to people.

Senior Managers Think Tank

Established in 2006, ARC NI facilitates a safe space for leaders to share news and views in relation to policy development required to enable high quality support for people with a learning disability; whilst also thinking outside the box in managing the organisational change required to deliver on personal outcomes for the people we support.
